<p><u>FRENCH BINATIONAL PROGRAM</u></p> <p>We understand the importance of transparency when it comes to how costs are allocated within the French Binational Program. We want to provide you with clarity on how fees are structured to ensure the continued success of the program. Below is a breakdown of the two main components that make up the costs: Staffing and Operational Costs.</p> <p><u>STAFFING (77%)</u></p> <p>Most of the program's costs are related to staffing, which is critical for maintaining the AEFE (Agence pour l'Enseignement Français à l'Étranger) accreditation. This requires additional staffing beyond what is covered by the Department of Education and Training.</p> <p>The specific elements within this component include:</p> <p>Staff Salaries: This covers the compensation of the additional staff employed to meet AEFE accreditation requirements.</p> <p>Annual Costs Associated with Superannuation / Long Service Leave Accrual / Work Cover: Financial provisions such as superannuation, long service leave accrual, and work cover insurance for these additional staff members are also included in this component.</p> <p><u>OPERATIONAL COSTS (23%)</u></p> <p>Operational expenses account for a smaller, but equally essential portion of the program's overall costs. These costs are key to ensuring the smooth operation of the French Binational Program:</p> <p>Recruitment Costs – Finding staff locally who meet the program's specific requirements is often a challenge, so we frequently need to recruit internationally. This varies year by year, depending on staffing needs.</p> <p>AEFE Professional Development / Memberships and Accreditation Fees: To maintain AEFE accreditation, there are necessary professional development programs, memberships, and fees. This ensures our staff remain qualified and updated on the latest educational standards.</p> <p>Binational Program Specific Resources: These are specialised resources and materials required to deliver the French Binational curriculum effectively.</p>	<p>\$3,310.00</p>

Student Assessment: Costs related to student assessments, which are integral for monitoring progress and maintaining educational standards within the program.

Replacement Staff for Planned Leave: When regular staff members take planned leave, hiring replacement staff is necessary to ensure the program continues without disruption.

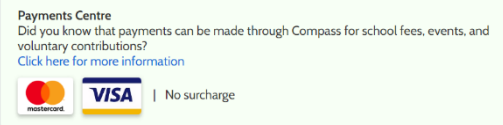

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
