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- Gr 3/4 Students will be required to purchase a device (Acer Travelmate B311 - 11.6" Non Touch, Celeron, 4GB, 128GB) as designated by CJC

 - Onsite repairs / fast turnaround

Important Notes

- Other BYODD devices will not be able to be used onsite by students to ensure network safety and continuity in classroom practice.
- **CJC strongly recommends** the additional purchase of insurance as accidents can and do happen – sometimes quite quickly!

FAQ



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What if I don't want my child to have a device?

- ICT is the reality of 21st century teaching and a one to one device approach is becoming more prevalent and ultimately required by all students when they enter high school

Why can't I use my own device?

- Devices may have competing programs that inhibit efficient use during class time
- Full cost of repair/replacement falls on parents at short notice
- Parents would need to provision access to Microsoft Office suite of applications and programs
- Differing amount of devices in one class inhibitive to standardised teaching practice

How will you adapt the curriculum to incorporate the use of the device?

- There is a standard ICT curriculum that is required to be delivered and planning for this will take place alongside other curriculum planning.

How will teachers ensure appropriate usage of the laptop in the classroom?

- CJC in conjunction with School Council will develop BYODD device and responsible use of technology policy, including cyber safety, to be implemented across the grade 3-6 cohort

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What will be the ratio on screen/off screen teaching?

- Learning will be structured with both on/off screen usage as required depending on the subjects being delivered at the time. the one to one device program does not in anyway replace the requirement for students to learn handwriting, note taking, planning and bookwork.

Will they have homework on their laptops?

- Homework will be structured with both on/off screen usage as required depending on the subjects being delivered at the time.

Do I need to install an antivirus software?

- No, it should come pre-loaded.

Does my child have full access to the internet while at school?

- No, students don't have full access to the internet during school hours. The school systems in place have limitations, so students aren't being exposed to explicit content. This is managed by our IT manager.

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What are the rules around the BYODD that children have to follow while at school?

- Before any digital device is used at school, students are required to sign an “Acceptable Use Of Digital Technologies Agreement”. If students do not follow the agreement, teachers will manage that behaviour within classrooms. If the behaviour continues to persist, the digital device may be taken away from students.
- Students are not able to use their digital device outside, before or after school, one of the reasons is to avoid damage to the device.

Safety at home: can I configure the laptop to be safe at home, ie blocking access to certain websites, etc?

- While at school, the classroom teachers have the responsibility to monitor and supervise the use of digital devices.
- Parents/carers have that responsibility at home. Using internet settings, parents can manually input websites that they would like blocked at home.

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How often and what do the children use their device for at school?

- It is difficult to be exact, as it depends on the week, topics that are being covered and progress of individual classes.
- Digital devices are used to enhance learning and not used as a tool to replace pen and paper. Some uses of the digital devices are to research, publish work and collaborate with peers.

Is my child's laptop stored in a safe and secure place while at school?

- There are locked cupboards in every classroom in the school.

The BYODD makes my child's bag heavy. Why can't the children leave their laptop at school during the week?

- The program is a BYODD. Students are responsible for the care of these devices and need to ensure they are charged and ready to learn. The school is not insured for these devices, therefore, if anything was to happen it would not be covered. Furthermore, the school doesn't have the infrastructure available to charge that number of devices every night.
- We would suggest looking at what is in the schoolbag and consider leaving items at school regularly.

Final Comment



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The BYODD program in 2022 has seen our students have far greater access and opportunity to build their Digital Technologies skills. Coding is starting across the school and we have a Digital Technologies consultant working with our staff to improve their capability.
